

Keeping a pulse on parents

> We aren't going to qualify for financial aid but we do want our student to be considered for merit aid. Is the FAFSA required for merit aid?

> Two reasons for not wanting to complete the FAFSA are 1. hassle, and 2. don't want to disclose financial information.

We understand some colleges want FAFSA for merit aid and some don't. Why would merit aid depend on parental income?





 - Text Message Campaigns (SMS Mongoose)
 - Orientation
 - Deregistration

- How do you make your program digestible to Students/Parents


People & Partners


- Who would you say are your top 3 campus partners?
