




Fifty years ago, a conversation at the 1967 SWASFAA Conference (New Orleans) led to the establishment of the Texas Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators and a steering committee that addressed the type, organization structure, financing and purpose of the group. Not long after, the Executive Committee wrote the *Constitution & Bylaws* and President Mack Adams was presiding over the one hundred financial aid officers attending the first Fall Conference in Austin. By 1980, TASFAA's members had provided consulting services to Texas financial aid offices, established the TASFAA Telephone Network, introduced the New Aid Officers Workshop initiative and was the third largest state association of its kind.

This Association is still on the move.

TASFAA continues to fulfill its mission regardless of the political climate, societal issues and economic landscape. This past year we have:





- Received recognition for the Associations efforts during the past fifty years with the adoption of Senate SR658 and House HR1546 resolutions;
- Further developed a mentor/protégé plan and online registration process;



This year, TASFAA celebrated its 50th anniversary and the conference represented a look back and reflected a vision for the future. The conference took

place in San Antonio, Texas and had 450 members in attendance.

Our keynote speaker spoke on Positive Psychology and we transition from there to national legislative update with NASFAA's Stephen Payne. After a break with our exhibitors, a federal town hall was hosted inviting the membership to ask questions of Stephen Payne, Rick Renshaw from Federal Student Aid and Lisa Blazer, NASFAA Past National Chair. We tried something new this year in an effort to honor our award recipients by foregoing the opening lunch and instead having an awards reception in the early evening on Wednesday. After being welcomed by mariachis and appetizers, our award reception began by honoring our service pin recipients. Our award winners were as follows:

In addition, 24 past presidents were in attendance and acknowledged for their service.

We found out in August that due to construction in the area, our traditional 5K fundraiser for Mack C. Adams would not be feasible. Instead, we offered Morning Stretch, a yoga-based exercise program that took place at the conference hotel. This was facilitated by Dr. Mary Kay Cooper and had 15 participants.

The conference committee received an overwhelming response to its request for proposals and as a result, the conference introduced several tracks for sessions including compliance, professional development, best practices, nuts and bolts and research. The topics appealed to a wide audience and were spaced throughout the day on Thursday. President Alan Ahmad gave a moving address to the membership during the business lunch by acknowledging the hard work all the committees have done throughout the year and new initiatives launched. He in turn introduced Dr. Christopher Murr as the new TASFAA President for 2018. We invited the membership to wear their 80s

best as we celebrated at our Thursday Dinner and Dance featuring the Spazmatics.

Friday morning was devoted to state programs and featured conversations about SB 0887 with Ginger Gossman from THECB and a state Legislative Update with Deputy Assistant Commissioner, Charles Puls.

In addition to all of this learning, TASFAA gave back to both the Mack C. Adams Professional Development Scholarship fund and the San Antonio Food Bank. A special 50th Anniversary shirt was sold and revenue went to the Mack C. Adams fund raising \$2,046. Members and institutions from across TASFAA were generous in donating items to a raffle benefitting the San Antonio Food Bank. We raised \$1,722 through raffle ticket sales.

The conference was immensely successful with plenty of opportunities for networking, learning and celebrating. The goal was to give to the membership a memorable 50th anniversary. We look forward to next year's conference in Galveston, which will be chaired by Jael Perez and Christina Pikla.

Federal Student Aid Training (formerly NT4CM)

No longer supported as NT4CM by FSA the training materials are now generalized. FSA website now includes a toolkit however most of the information covers financial aid as a broader scope. Each host to an early awareness workshop will need to 'create' their own presentations.

Several TASFAA member schools have hosted Early Awareness training in 2016-17. Workshops continue to be scheduled for 2017, with the latest at Texas A&M University in December.

Feedback from those whom have hosted so far this year has been positive. High schools that I have visited and spoken with their guidance counselors are being very proactive with regards to having their students register for their FSA IDs as well as completing the FAFSA early on. Many conversations regarding income year used versus this being a "Special Circumstance," or reviewed using professional judgement continues to take place.

All in all the message of paying for college is mainly the students' and/or parents' responsibility is being spread. There is help available for those in need. Defining need is an ongoing work.

There has not been a state chair early awareness conference call since August but we have reached out to NASFAA to see where they stand on training with regards to early awareness. No comments on this discussion at this time.

We have welcomed a new member to our committee, Melissa Jones, financial aid advisor from Temple College. We are in the early stages of discussing how important it is to get the message out to middle school students and may try to develop a workshop series geared in this direction.

The TASFAA Training Committee is honored to have successfully executed two training programs offered by the association: the Spring New Aid Officer's Workshop and the Fall ABC Workshop, for both new and seasoned financial aid professionals. One of the most exciting endeavors the committee achieved was moving the New Aid Officer's Workshop to Houston from the traditional Dallas/Fort Worth location. The workshop was hosted at the Houston Marriott West Loop by the Galleria, May 22-24th, and successfully trained seventy-seven new financial aid professionals. The Houston location was a significant success and the 2018 New Aid Officer's Workshop will be hosted again in Houston.

The New Aid Officer's theme name was "Out of This World", to keep in step with the spirt of Houston and the Space Program. True to our theme, the committee hosted a space costume party with the TASFAA Board, and even Marvin the Martian joined the event to dine on Mac and Cheese and partake of the S'mores buffet.

We were honored to include a guest speaker, Dr. Louis Carfagno, who has been responsible for training astronauts and implementing space teambuilding programs for NASA. Dr. Carfagno was delighted to be invited to the Houston New Aid Officer's Workshop and tailored his presentation on the importance of team-building and customer service for the financial aid professional. In addition, our second guest speaker was TWU University Registrar, Robert Lothringer, who customized a FERPA presentation geared towards the Financial Aid Professional.

The nuts and bolts of the NAOW education featured content areas such as Professional Judgment, Packaging, Need Analysis, Verification, Satisfactory Academic Progress, the History of Financial Aid, Return of Title IV Funds, and Income-Driven Repayment Plans. In addition, new curriculum subjects were introduced which were Loans, Financial Literacy, an overview of Enrollment Services and Understanding and Improving Communication (D.O.P.E. Training). The Texas Higher Education Board presented State Programs and Updates, and Training Officers from the Department of Education covered the topics of Pell and Campus-Based Programs.

The Training Committee boasts the proud distinction of 102 combined years of higher education experience in various capacities. In addition, this talented group of professionals holds a combined total of twenty-five NASFAA national credentials that have demonstrated mastery of an array of financial aid subjects. The Training Team also participated in team developments endeavors, such as participating in the Webinar provided by Great Lakes, "— It's Not All in the Delivery: Presenting Your Presentations" in an effort to continually improve presentation and teaching methods.

This past year the Training Committee developed and implemented numerous new and creative ideas. One of the key areas of emphasis was marketing the importance of the TASFAA Training services to the Higher Education Community, by developing a Directors' Information letter. In addition, a professional bio was created to provide visibility to each presenter's areas of teaching expertise, and basic information. With limited budgets, we wanted to provide visibility and return on investment to justify a direct savings cost for developing training programs for financial aid professionals. In addition, we utilized new technology platforms for marketing.

This fall the ABC Workshop was coordinated with the TASFAA Fall Conference and 50th Anniversary event in San Antonio, Texas on October 8th and 9th in a rigorous day and a half curriculum. The

basics were covered in a day and a half of a rigorous schedule. The fall ABC Workshop theme was keeping in step with fifty years, named "Through the Ages." Fifty-four new financial aid administrators were trained at the ABC workshop.

It is with great pleasure that all nine committee members have informed me that they will remain on the committee for the 2018 NAOW and ABC events. This extraordinary team will be able to explore new roles on this committee, continue with professional development, and implement fresh and creative ideas.

Future 2018 goals are to encourage the Mentor and Protégé Programs to train new committee

members, continue adding guest speakers that cover additional areas of Enrollment Services, and develop a Director's Letter to obtain their feedback on our workshops.

I look forward to serving another year as Chair for the 2018 TASFAA Training Committee. In addition, I am pleased to announce Ms. Rachael Fournier is serving as Co-Chair.

It's been an honor to have a talented, motivated, trained committee that will meet the needs of the TASFAA organization, the institutions, and professionally grow, develop new skills, and teach future financial aid officers timely, effective and relevant information.
